
New Consent and Application Review Attestation Requirements



- If you live in a state that uses healthcare.gov and you choose to use an agent or broker to assist you with your enrollment, you will be required to sign two consent forms
- The first is a Prior Consent Form that must be signed giving the agent permission to work with you. The consent can be in written or recorded.
- The second agreement you will be asked to sign a written or recorded agreement that you have reviewed the information on your application and agree to its accuracy. Also you need to receive and review the final attestations on the application. This is for your protection and prevents inaccurate information from being submitted in your name.
- This is a requirement by CMS (The Centers of Medicare and Medicaid) as of June 18, 2023. Agents and brokers in Federal Marketplace states that use healthcare.gov who do not follow these steps are in violation of this law
